## **SNOW REMOVAL POLICY**

Snow removal operations begin upon the accumulation of snowfall.

During a snow event, the town primarily has plows and sanders working the priority streets, hills and intersections. As the storm winds down, the plows then will work the secondary street areas, followed by the town assigned sidewalk areas and parking lots.

Residents are required to clear sidewalks adjacent to their property within12 hours after the snow event concludes.

The town does not plow or treat the alleys in Clifton Forge. Residents are reminded that when digging out driveways, sidewalks and cars, snow should not be thrown out into the road. Doing so, causes hazardous roads for both the residents and the plow truck operators who have to return and plow the snow back out of the road.

The town had worked with the county to arrange trash removal during or after the storm. If snowfall exceeds 6 inches, residents will need to place their trash receptacle on the street side of their property not in the alley for collection.

For extreme snow conditions, residents should park on only one side of the street or alternate street side parking to facilitate snow removal operations

Upon the conclusion of major snowfalls, the Public Works Director will determine if snow removal/hauling is needed.
