Chuck discussed with Council about the VML policy committee appointments and meetings. The VML sent out a form to allow local governments to nominate their governing body member and appointed staff to serve on a committee. Packets were given to the council members that provided the nomination paper to return to the VML.

4. MANAGERS COMMENTS

-Community Garden packets are located downstairs in Town Hall to reserve and pay for a garden spot. The Parks and Trails committee plan to have 20 garden beds made but it is open ended, and it may grow over time depending on the number of spots reserved.

-The Community Gathering will be Thursday evening, David Hill and Maria Saxton will be in attendance to talk about the future development in Clifton Forge.

-Guard rail on Keswick was issued today to be replaced.

-Family Dollar/ Dollar Tree is still closed due to plumbing issues, we sent public works over to make sure everything was fine on the Town's side. The plumbing issues seem to be an issue within the store and doesn't have anything to do with the Town. There isn't an estimated opening date set.

-The Recycling Compactor located at Public Works is being used a lot and with the new update and new recycling company the Town has been able to save a tremendous amount of money.

-Columbia Gas met at Town Hall last Thursday to discuss the issues of not notifying the Town when they show up. Chuck and Chris Keyser met with them and came to an agreement to meet on a quarterly basis even if they don't have any work. Ingalls will be a 6-7-week project as long as weather

corporates. The gas company is replacing 55 service lines and once they are all placed properly, they will remove all 55 old lines. Once the replacements are completed and asphalt companies open back up the restoration team will come in and fix the roads.

-Chuck announced that the Town of Clifton Forge and the City of Covington are working together on an important funding opportunity to benefit the Town and City. They are getting joint support from the Alleghany highlands Chamber of Commerce and Tourism's funding application for the project titled "Regional Downtown and Community Revitalization Project". Both the City of Covington and Town of Clifton Forge are committed to revitalizing our downtowns and the funding application could significantly impact our region as a whole.

The Parks and Trails have been working hard to put together the sensory trail and Mac beard has been working hard to help with flower beds. He ended by thanking everyone for coming to the meeting.

Jeff also thanked Shorty for dedicating his time with the 15 St. Josephs children.
